After a successful flight and an extensive inspection, the aircraft is now fully operational again in Uganda. Due to the increased number of flight requests, we as a program are happy with the extra aircraft! We now have 5 aircraft at our disposal.

Childrens home

What will happen to you if your father breaks his leg and can no longer work? Then you will unfortunately just get kicked out your house. This happened to Daniel and his younger brother. Together with their father, they ended up on the streets because they could no longer pay their rent. Fortunately, Daniel and his brother can temporarily live in the children's home until his father recovers and can take care of them again. Every week Marlies visits this children's home in the slums of Kampala. While another MAF woman shares the Gospel with the mothers, Marlies does a Bible program with the children.



Thunderstorms

The climate in Kampala is quite comfortable with afternoon temperatures ranging from 24 to 32 degrees. But did you know that Kampala is also the city with the most thunderstorms in the world? Its location on the equator causes heavy tropical rain and thunderstorms, regularly flooding of the streets and causing mudslides from the many hills. Traffic has to struggle through dozens of centimeters of muddy water. All electricity cables run above ground and during thunderstorms we often experience power cuts.
