### **Healing and hope**

A small smile appears on the face of this young South Sudanese boy, as I carefully take him from his mother. I have just landed in Tororo, a town in the Southeast of Uganda. My passengers for today are five young children with their mothers. Although the children look different, one thing that stands out is their large heads. They are born with a so-called hydrocephalus. This morning, I have picked them up in Juba, South Sudan and now I am handing them over to a medical team from CURE Hospital. Born into difficult circumstances without adequate medical care, these kids now have the opportunity to undergo a life-changing surgery.





The doctors at CURE Hospital work tirelessly and operate dozens of children with hydrocephalus or spina bifida every week. Not only does the CURE Hospital team provide medical care for the children, but they also share something deeper with the parents: the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Parents, weary of their children's struggles, find comfort in words of hope and recovery.

Sometimes at the end of the day I wonder who or what I actually have flown. But today on the way home I realize once again that I carry more than cargo on every flight. We carry dreams, healing and the promise of a better future.






